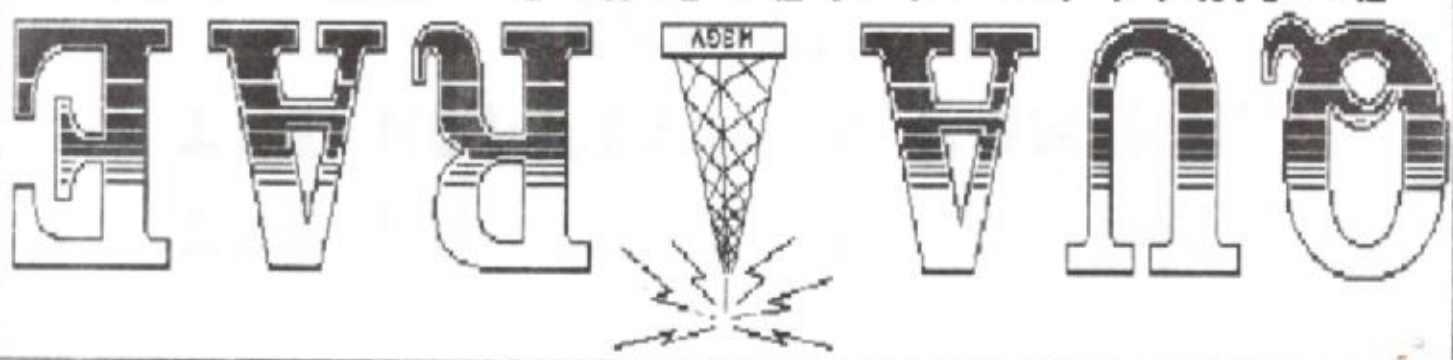

We need our repeater, let's protect the license

Ever since the club decided earlier this year to allow the repeater telephone patch to be accessed by pressing a star and dumped with a pound, a few of you have complained that the patch is "never up."

That's not exactly true. Although the patch may not be up when you try to dial, a control operator is generally not far away and will bring it up for you. Without the control op on duty, the patch cannot be legally used. In fact, if you use it, your license is in jeopardy as is the trustee's license. The club wants to operate the repeater and patch legally, and if you don't care about jeopardizing your license, the club cares about risking its license.

Emergency use is primary

Keep in mind the repeater's main function is emergency communication, the basis upon which we sought the grant from Rye Community Foundation. Our daily use of it is obviously not prohibited, and is beneficial to make sure it functions properly. We must be certain, though, that the machine is available during emergencies. And part of making sure that it is available is that we maintain a license by operating the machine legally.

If you don't mind if we would run an illegal machine, then step forward if you're qualified and offer to be station trustee, and offer to reimburse the \$10,000 grant to the community foundation. Then we could remove the machine from emergency availability, and say and do anything we please and risk your license.

Listen to yourself before complaining

If we would just listen to ourselves while about every facet of the machine, as a great number of scanner listeners do, we would be embarrassed. Are we radio amateurs or glorified CBers? Listen to the repeater from the scanner listener's perspective before you

answer.

Many of you who constantly complain are the same people who have not volunteered a single minute to work on the repeater, raise an antenna, attend a repeater committee meeting, or spend an afternoon as control operator. Don't you think its time you put up or shut up?

Does that sound harsh? It is.

Put yourself in the position of the many repeater committee members and volunteers who have given hours and hours to get the machine operational. How would you like to see your volunteer hours minimized by a bunch of carping, petulant adolescents who don't care whose license they jeopardize?

Is there room for improvement?

Is there anything to complain about with our repeaters? You bet there is. There are many areas that we could stand improvement, and I'll be the first to admit it. But the committee is constituted by the lack of funds, as almost any organization is, and is hampered because we keep asking the same people to give more and more time. And while they keep on giving, they have to listen to a certain few of you continually carp on the air about the phone patch.

That gets old.

About ducking toll calls

While we're on legal use, we still have those who continually want to use the patch from outside the Erie telephone calling area. How many times must you be told that you shouldn't use the patch to duck a toll call? If you have to make a call that badly, stop and dump some change into pay phone, or buy a mobile telephone. Finally, let me update you on the reverse patch. We still can't find a way to let the telephone caller listen on the phone before raising the reverse patch. When we can resolve this legally, we'll make the reverse patch available.

FCC EXAMS for Novice through Amateur Extra are given the first Saturday of each month in Room 107, A'Hearn Hall, Villa Maria Campus, 2551 W. 12th Street. The orange RAE FCC EXAM sign is always displayed at the entrance, and the VE Team goes on duty at 7:30 A.M., when candidates begin completing their 610 forms, so testing can commence at 8 A.M.

Forty five exams were given in April and May. Fifteen candidates tested for the codeless Technician license and of the five who passed, there was one each from Bradford, Meadville, NorthEast, Erie and Concord, Ohio. Although the Technician license has proved popular in the past seven years as a stepping stone in upgrading, indications are that it will be even more so in the future.

Anyone who has a Certificate of Completion (CSCB) for element 2 (Novice theory) or has been credited with this and their 610 is on file at the ARRL/VEC office, and it is still within the 365 day limit, can be credited toward a codeless Technician license. The Erie VE Team has always issued a CSCB for any elements passed, and also had all 610s filed with the ARRL/VEC office, so if in the event you have lost your CSCB, not only does the VE Team have a copy of the CSCB, but proof is also available at Newington, Conn.

It is also possible that some have credit for both the Novice and Technician theory, while not the code, and if the time limit has not expired on the CSCBs, the codeless Technician license has already been earned and can be made available upon application.

August 1991 Meeting

Officers and Directors in attendance were:
N3HUM, N3HPR, N3GDS, WB3KKT, N13Q, W3ZQS, N3FAW.

There were several corrections to the minutes of the July 1991 meeting. The corrections include Qua-Rae page number and paragraph.
1. Page 5 paragraph 8: Change "It was reported by several VE team members" to "It was reported by KB3P, a VE team member."
2. Page 5 paragraph 9: Add "K3ZE insists that programming can be changed to let phones listen before initiating a reverse patch."
3. Page 5 paragraph 8: Add N3GDS very strongly expressed his opinions toward K3ZE and was called out of order."
4. Page 4: Add "N3GDS read a proposed By-laws change as follows:
Paragraph (A) subparagraph (1) delete the words "voting rights"
Paragraph (A) subparagraph (2) delete the words "voting or"
Paragraph (H) subparagraph (a) amend to read:
"All members meeting the criteria of paying full base annual dues shall be eligible to vote."
A motion by WB3FJP/K3WUN that the minutes be accepted as corrected was passed by oral vote.

Directors' Report - N3GDS Jerry reported that the By-laws will be available at the meetings for pick-up as it would be expensive to mail them to all the members. They are being readied for print this month. The Board is looking into setting up another station on the Niagara.

Treasurers' Report - N3HUM Eric reports the following: Life membership \$1295, Education \$644, Public Service \$1540, Savings \$107, Checking \$682, Certificates of Deposit \$2677.

Elections committee - K3WUN Not many nominations sent in, please do so by August 12.

Property - WB3DOM All equipment is available but the Digicom board needs repair.

Membership - N3FAW Bob reports 189 members total.

Public Service - N3HUM Eric asked for help with the horse trials on 8/3 & 8/4. He also reported the "Pedal to the Peak" in October and the ErieSistible Marathon in September will require many volunteers. N3GDS/N13Q moved to approve working at the ErieSistible marathon -- passed by oral vote.

Repeater - There has not been a meeting in several months so N3HPR (President) requests that the repeater committee meet prior to the October meeting where a full report will be given to the membership.

Contest - WB3DOM FD logs were sent in. W3PIX will coordinate the PA QSO Party again this year.

Qua-Rae - WB3KKT can use articles that would be of interest to the membership.

Education - WB3DOM Novice classes begin in September. Vern volunteered for code but there have been no volunteers for theory yet. Don't be shy.

VE Team - W3CG The last exam session had 23 candidates of which 17 upgraded and 6 partially upgraded. The VE team is saving money for room rent next year.

Christmas Party - N3HPR To be held 12/06/1991 at the waterfall restaurant in Harborcreek.

ARES/SKYWARN - WB3DGD Ernie met with Paul Sowash who requires much information be gathered and that we set up an organization chart, list of resources, etc. ID cards will be earned through participation in nets, drills, and other activities. KZ3E mentioned that WA3HJC has much of the needed information.

HAMFEST - N3HPR Ticket to be mailed within a week plus fliers will be sent to 400 non-members in the area. A mailing party will be held at the RC on Tuesday evening at 7pm.

OLD BUSINESS

KZ3E asked when the last audit was performed. N3GDS reported that the last complete audit was completed was in 1989.

N3GDS read the proposed change to the By-laws for the second time (see corrections to minutes above). The By-laws change was voted upon and passed by the membership present.

KZ3E asked again why the VE team will not reimburse the RAE for the funds the RAE paid to Villa Maria for room rent now that the VE team can keep a good portion of the exam fees for paying rent etc. There was much discussion between KZ3E, W3CG, N13Q, and N3HPR about the issue. WB3FJP/W3SN moved that the issue be tabled until the next meeting because there is a speaker/demonstration following the meeting. The issue was tabled.

KB3P asked for help repairing radios for the center for the blind. KB3P read a letter concerning Part 97 and the Radio Amateur (printed elsewhere in this issue).

KZ3E asked why many user functions of the repeater aren't available to the members. N3HPR restated his request that a Repeater Committee meeting be held soon so these questions may be answered. Discussion followed. W3ILA excused himself from the meeting. KZ3E alleged that full reports are not given to the membership by the repeater committee. WB3FJP/K3WUN moved that the meeting be adjourned, passed by oral vote with one may by KZ3E.

Meeting adjourned at 8:35pm

THE FCC RECENTLY ANNOUNCED the shut down of the station of Mark Meece, N8ICW, a Technician class operator found operating on the 40 meter band. Instead of the traditional \$750 fine, Meece was fined \$1,000 under the Commission's new fine authority. CRIMINAL PENALTIES ASSOCIATED WITH UNAUTHORIZED TRANSMISSIONS CAN REACH UP TO \$100,000. --ouch, Ed

One might assume that any person holding an amateur operators license has read and is familiar with Part 97 of the FCC radio regulations. Part 97 applies to amateur radio operation. However this assumption may not be true. Perhaps many of us just rely on hear-say, the opinions of friends or others, for our interpretation of the rules. Let's take an on-going case of "out of band" operation. Except for a life threatening emergency there is no justification for a tech call in the 20 meter band or anywhere else in the HF spectrum except the novice sub-bands and the 28.300 to 28.500 MHz segment of the 10 meter band. Even during third party operation, when third party is permissible, the control operator sits at the elbow of the third party operator and the call of the control operator, of a class appropriate to the band, is used. Any operator using a tech call in the 20 meter band or any band where tech is prohibited is in violation regardless of any cock and bull story about third party operation. Furthermore, a licensee who knowingly holds contact with a violator is himself a violator. Know the law. Don't jeopardize your hard earned operating privileges.

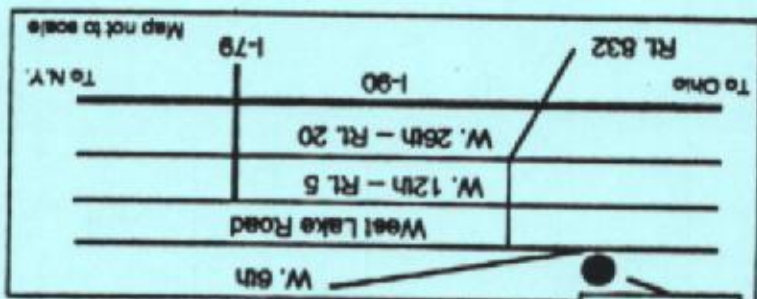

Jerry, N3GDS interjected that he had called the office of the District Attorney and was told that Kents' recording the club meeting was in violation of wire-tapping laws. Ken insisted he could legally record a public meeting. Tom explained that RAE meetings are only for RAE members and invited guests and are not considered public meetings. Tom then asked Ken to please turn the recorder off. Ken then stated that he would hold Tom responsible for any mistakes in the minutes and turned the recorder off.

N3GDS then corrected the minutes of the August meeting to note that KZ3E recorded the August meeting without permission which was a violation of wire-tapping laws. The minutes were then approved.

Directors Report - N3GDS Jerry read his report (elsewhere in this issue) and reminded the membership that those elected tonight will take office in January 1992.

Treasurers' Report - N3HUM Eric reported \$2823 checking, \$664 education, \$108 savings, \$1296 life membership, \$1541 public service, and \$2677 in CDs for a total of \$9108 in the treasury.
