

1994-1995 Scholarships for Radio Amateurs

The Foundation for Amateur Radio, Inc., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D.C., plans to administer forty-nine (40) scholarships for the academic year 1994-1995 to assist licensed Radio Amateurs. The Foundation, composed of fifty local area Amateur Radio Clubs, fully funds five of these scholarships with the income from grants and its annual Hamfest. The remaining forty-four (44) are administered by the Foundation without cost to the various donors.

Licensed Radio Amateurs may compete for these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled in or have been accepted for enrollment at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$500 to \$2000 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas or the pursuit of certain study programs. Clubs, especially those in Delaware, Florida, Maine, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Wisconsin, are encouraged to announce these opportunities at their meetings, on their nets, during training classes, and in their club newsletters.

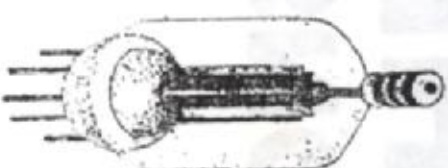

test that the FCC not only
requires that any current
original license and a copy be
brought to the test point, but
now also requires that any
current Certificate of
Completion (CSCE), plus a copy
of that, must also be
furnished.

Until recently, information
from the original CSCE was
recorded on the 610 form by the
VE Team. The new 610 forms no
longer carry provisions for
this information, so a copy of
the CSCE must also be furnished
to accompany the 610 form.

gained his Novice ticket.
