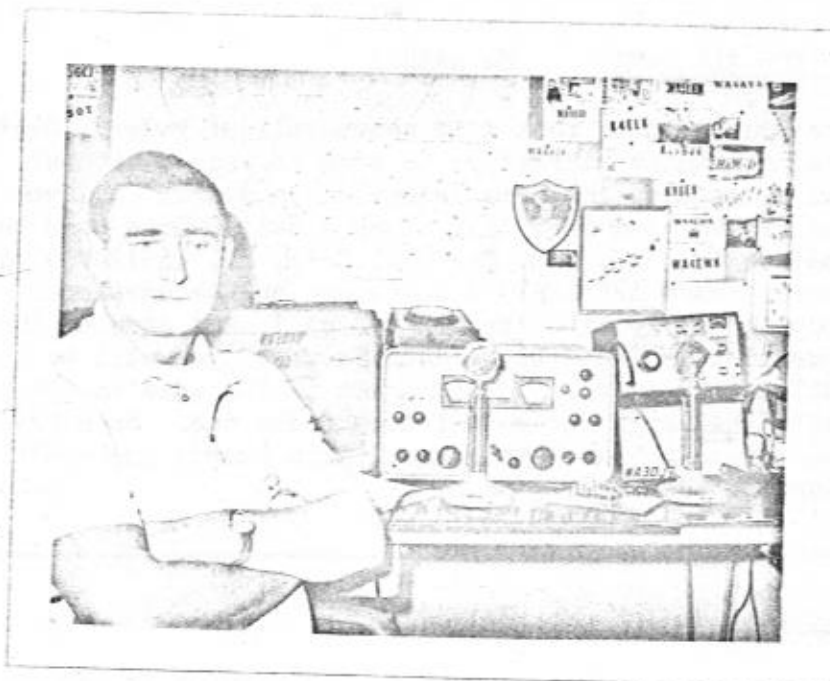

The rig at his 39th Street QTH is a DX100 and HQ 180 for AM work and a Galaxy V for sideband contacts. His antenna is a Mini beam and an all band dipole, both of which rest on his 40 foot red tower that can be easily seen when driving on Peach Street.

Jack spends a great deal of time on the Eye Bank Net at 3970 each evening at 8:00. Jack states that the Eye Bank provides eye tissue throughout the United States as fast as is humanly possible. Propagation Report de WA3HSR

- 10 meters ... Conditions good in the morning to Europe with some African stations heard in the afternoon. South America in the late afternoon and early evening with Asians on the increase. Band closings are still early but look for longer openings with the increasing daylight.
- 15 meters ... Band usually opens 8:00 AM with very good European signals. Europeans good until about 1:00 PM when Africans can be heard until about 5:00. South America and some Asians follow until the band closes about 2 hours after sunset.
- 20 meters ... Best results for DX seem to be in the morning, late afternoon and evening hours.
- 40 meters ... Good conditions for short distance contacts with lengthening skip throughout the day reaching peak at night and early morning.
- 80 meters ... Follows 40 meters with maximum distance at night and early morning.

Internationally Known Radio Amateur to Speak at RAE de K3AFO

Internationally known, W8GZ, Loren G. Windom will be the featured speaker at the March 19 RAE Meeting. Mr. Windom is the inventor of the famous multiband antenna called the "off-center feed" or "Windom antenna". The antenna enjoyed its greatest popularity in the 1930's and 1940's. This antenna has been used for many years by Erie Amateur Radio Operators and with great success.

Loren will discuss the difficulties that resulted in the development of the "Windom" antenna and many of his experiences as a young man in amateur radio along with the fascinating events in his later life as he continued in ham radio.

Following Mr. Loren G. Windom, will be Mr. Harold W. Shaner (licensed in the 1930's as W8NHD and later W3NHD), General Transmission and Protection Engineer at the Gen. Tel. Co. Mr. Shaner will discuss transmission lines and standing waves with his famous "Wave Machine". Mr. Shaner, an expert in the field of transmission, will certainly give new insight to the Standing Wave Problem.

New Transmitter Hunt Rules Adopted de WA3GSH

To start the new year off on the right foot a new set of rules has been adopted for the dual-band transmitter hunts which are held on the third Sunday of every month. These rules were generated and approved by transmitter hunt chairman Fred Tate, WA3GIV, and Carl Rimmer, K3OSU. The rules that are to go in effect are retroactive to January 1970. Hence, those individuals who participated in January's hunt can claim scores according to the following rules. The new rules have tried to overcome much of the criticism that has been advanced in the past. It is hoped that these rules will be useful in contributing to the success that these transmitter hunts have enjoyed.

The following rules have been submitted by WA3GIV and K3OSU:

Basic Scoring (Each Band Individually)

First Place 10 Points
Second Place 5 Points
Other mobiles
(Other than 1st or 2nd) 2 Points

(Cont'd)

New Transmitter Hunt Rules (Cont'd)

Each licensed amateur who rides with a participating mobile is awarded one point for each licensed amateur who is a passenger with his mobile; no mobile can claim more than a MAXIMUM of four points for passengers even though he may be carrying more than four in his vehicle.

The HIDDEN MOBILE forfeits any points normally derived from passengers that may be riding with him; these passengers, however, can claim one point each in the same way that passengers in the competing mobiles other than the hidden mobile do.

HIDING OPTION

To increase flexibility a Hiding Option has been established. The first place winner of the transmitter hunt on each band shall have the option of hiding the transmitter for the next month's hunt. In the event that he does not wish to hide the transmitter the individual who had been regularly scheduled to hide the transmitter for that month shall assume the responsibility for hiding the transmitter. If the first-place winner chooses to pick up the option of hiding the transmitter he receives ten points. If he declines the option the individual who was scheduled to hide the transmitter and receives ten points.

If the individual who was scheduled to hide the transmitter has forfeited this opportunity to the first-place winner, and (who has chosen to pick up the option) has not yet had the chance to hide the transmitter at some time during the year: then this individual receives ten point BOGEY for having been denied the opportunity to hide the transmitter.

BOGEY

Any mobile who has been denied the opportunity to hide the transmitter at some time during the year shall receive ten points. The ten points are to be awarded at the end of the transmitter hunt competition for the year and can only be awarded to mobiles who have entered at least one transmitter hunt.

Points earned in the transmitter hunts are non-transferrable.

Any mobile who sustains a speeding ticket or is involved in a car-pedestrian accident shall be disqualified from that particular transmitter hunt. (No fender-benders allowed fellas).

These rules represent the new system that is to be used for future transmitter hunts. This scoring should spice up the general participation. It must be noted that to date no one has decided whether splashing mud inside K3AFO's automobile shall be considered serious enough to warrant immediate disqualification on the part of the offender.

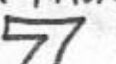
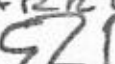
10 METERS de K3AFO

To save on battery drain, the radio transmitter on the satellite will only be operated on weekends (7:00 pm Fri. to 7:00 Sund.) Happy tracking!
2. Ten meter net control station for the month of February will be WA3HSR. WA3DJT did a good job for the month of January. Lets keep the quality of net operation up. How about checking for late comers or newcomers midway through the comments? Other pre-requisites for net control should be ability to receive signals in the Tri-State area and have a signal that can be heard. Also, net control should be able to operate "rapid-fire" How about considering some of these factors Frank? Let's get those check-ins to at least 40 per net.
3. Much local SSB and AM activity can be heard at both ends of 10 meters with W3RVM, W3MMJ, W3KKT, W3QN, W3AQY holding down the fort at one end and WA3DJT, K3ABG, K3TUP, W3CUV and K3LIG balancing the band at the other. It's great to hear all that local QRM..
4. The real long haul openings are just around the corner on 10 meters. Look for such prefixes as HS, XW8, 9M2, VU2, 4S7 during February and March. Last year the big day was March 29.
5. Transmitter Hunt on February 15, 1969, 6:30 pm. Don't forget the new scoring system. Go out and get some points. Winner at end of year (along with 2nd place) will receive a valuable award.

The Radio Association of Erie is making tentative plans for a 3 day expedition to Serrana Bank or Roncador Cay. Permission has already been granted by the FCC to operate under the call of W3GV/KS4B. Operation will take place sometime in June/ July or August. Much depends on transportation connections and the amount of financial support that can be received for this expedition.

Serrana Bank is located 14° 25' N. Lat. and 80° 16' W. Long. It is approximately 150 Mi North East. of San Andres Island (HKØ). Roncador Cay is located 13° 35' N. Lat. and 80° 14' W. Long. It is about 125 Mi. from San Andres.

Both islands were claimed by the U.S. in 1919 and count as a separate country listing on the ARRL DXCC (KS4B). They are both uninhabited and are very much sought after by the thousands of world DXers. More information will appear on the W3GV Expedition in the coming issues of the QUA-RAE.
