ARRL'S DIRECTOR'S NOTEBOOK

The pulse-type interference on 20 meters, originating in the Soviet Union, has reared its head again, resulting in a number of complaints from amateurs and another telegram from the U.S. to the Soviet Union. If you are queried by members in your division about this interference, please tell them that we are doing everything possible within official and legal channels to resolve the problem. (Interference has now ceased, presumably because of publicity and pressure through office channels. ____Ed.)

The FCC has taken action in Docket 20686, essentially adopting the changes in portable and mobile station identification procedures which were proposed in late January (April QST, page 48). Effective November 26, all requirements for prior notification of extended portable operation are dropped. FCC-licensed amateurs operating their stations at portable or mobile locations within FCC jurisdiction no longer will be required to indicate their portable or mobile status when they identify. There are no changes in the identification requirements for reciprocal licensees, who are still required to observe Section 97.313.

While licensees will no longer be required to indicate portable or mobile status, they will be permitted to do so, and we might well indicate a requirement to do so in the rules for some of our contests and other operating activities in order to minimize confusion.

The FCC has announced that effective November 2, two-letter calls with "X" as the first letter of the suffix will be available for assignment. This provides 52 additional two-letter calls for each call area. An announcement of the opening of the "N" prefix block is expected soon, though an application now would be premature.

Effective January 1, 1977, DX contest logs may no longer be used in lieu of QSL's for DXCC credit.

The Attorney General of the State of Illinois has asked for a permanent injunction halting the operations of Trigger Electronics, River Forest, Ill. The Attorney General alleges that Israel Treger, who operates Trigger Electronics, has been guilty of violations of the state's Consumer Fraud Act and the Illinois Deceptive Practices Act because of his false and misleading advertising. The Attorney General alleges that Treger has been guilty of refusal or neglect to ship items of equipment ordered by consumers, demands for extra payments before shipment due to price increases occasioned by Treger's own late delivery, and constant employment of delaying tactics in response to customer inquiries about their prepaid orders.

The Consumer Fraud and Protections Division has requested that individuals who have complaints against Treger, and who have not yet communicated them to the Attorney General, forward them to that office at 134 N. LaSalle Street, Room 204, Chicago, Illinois 60602, Attention: Jon McPhee.

The Treasurer, WA3EAY, reported that only an electrical bill was paid for since last meeting which left us with a balance of \$78.00.

WA3ZX0 reported on the work which he and WA3LSY has done so far in their updating of WR3ACA. He stated that Ider parts, rack panels, feedthroughs were on order and was currently waiting for the transformer from WA3HDK. He also indicated that he now had some schematics to present to K3QHO, the technical designee from the club, for his approval.

Due to the limited attendance, WA3UCP elected not to present the new rules for adoption until a larger membership turnout permits.

WA3ZX0 moved that the repeater committee send an appreciation letter to WA3MKT for use of his Prog Line Transmitter for the past two months. WA3EAY seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

No further business was brought up, but since the attendees were quite interested in how the repeater audio system functions, WA3LSY explained to the group in length how the proposed update on WR3ACA will work. We followed along on his schematic while he explained how each function of COR, time out, and audio fit into the picture.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 PM.

HR REPORTS

Number 117 - October 15, 1976

AMATEUR NOVICE TRAINING PROGRAM has five times the enrollment over last year... 35,000 and expected to climb to 40,000 with many novices coming from the CB bands. Delays continue in the FCC's Experimental Novice License Program. Expect to wait months for licenses as Gettysburg's going to be inundated with fall students soon.

OSCAR 6 is now four years old with over 18,300 orbits while OSCAR 7 will be two years old.

CANADIAN CB will expand to 40 channels effective April 1, 1977.

ARRL MIDWEST DIVISION HAMFEST had 1000-1500 attendees and was termed successful. (RAE is anticipating well above this amount at its 1977 HAMJAM--Ed.)

YAESU ELECTRONICS is new name of Yaesu Musen USA.

HEATHKIT ANNOUNCED their new 2M rig, the HW-2036, synthesized with built-in continuous tone encoder, non-harmonic spur suppression of better than 70 dB, \$269.95.

COLLINS has raised its prices 50% on entire amateur line making the 75S-3C \$2300!

KENWOOD'S TR-7400A 25 watt synthesized 2M rig available in December.

ICOM 2M BASE STATION coming, IC-211, with all mode capability, digital readout, 10 watts output for \$749. IC-230 is being discontinued with a replacement coming.

TRIGGER ELECTRONICS case moves on as Illinois Attorney General wants to seize their assets and appoint a receiver. Illinois has received over 100 complaints.

NEW CANADIAN LICENSE CLASSES similar to USA's proposed by Department of Communications has received favorable responses in a CRRL survey.

ARRL'S BICENTENNIAL CONTEST may become annual affair under new name since many liked format.

Dear Editor,

There is a small group of progressive amateurs locally who would be glad to work for the good of the club if it weren't for some of the "old timers" who, for some unknown reason feel that everyone who wants to do something for the club is out to get something for himself. It happens everytime, every proposal made by this progressive group is questioned by the oldtimers to the extent that even absurd agreements must be signed in order to help out the club. Even out and out accusations of profiteering and kickbacks have been made by some of these oldsters in public. Is it any wonder that the progressive group, the group that has a lot of technical know-how and energy, are reluctant to work for the club.

When this progressive group does do something for the club, such as a fund-raising activity, all of the money earned is immediately snatched up by those old timers, who didn't do anything to help earn it, and hoarded away for some obscure purpose. Seldom does any of the money get spent to help the amateurs of Erie (or anywhere else for that matter.) Even nonfund-raising activities are maligned by these oldsters. Activities such as amateur radio code and theory classes, marchathons, air show co-ordination, and field day are made to work by the progressive group with little or no assistance from these old timers or the club as a whole, but guess who is there when it comes time to take the credit for these activities. You guessed it--the club that didn't do much of anything to promote them.

Sure, the club has done some things that they can be proud of. They can be proud of the 1951 model year communications van which can sometimes pass inspection. They can be proud of their Harvey-Wells 6m gear. They can be proud of their all tube-type 2m transceiver that may or may not work. They can be proud of their HF station that is not on the air. They can be proud of a repeater that looks like a rat's nest and is not composed of all club equipment. They can be proud of the fact that all of 10 percent of the membership bothers to show up at club meetings. All of these resources go scarcely tapped. Why try to start an antique can when a complete 80 thru 2 meter mobile station in working order can be borrowed on a moments notice from one of the progressive group. Why cart around a heavy tube-type transceiver that may or may not work when a small, light, solid state unit that will work can be borrowed from one of the progressive group. Why bother to try to put a club HF station on the air when no one wants to use it anyway. Why try to improve a repeater that already works. Why spend money on the amateurs that helped earn it. This is apparently the philosophy that has carried the club for over a quarter of a century. Why change now? It must work. When will the RAE wake up?

True, there have been times when personal obligations kept me away, but I tried to keep them few. But I believe that we work best when we work together--regimentation, if you wish--to achieve long-term goals. I'm not sure your negative approach will gain you anything but less help. Let's get in there and make some of the changes you suggest, but let's not step on others who may not share your same interests. And most of all, let's not drive good people from our fraternity and FROM OUR BANDS by bad-mouthing the world from our 2-meter perch.

Dear Editor,

Well, it is getting close to the end of the year and that means that repeater dues as well as club dues will be due.

I will be interested to see the number of "county" users of WA3ACA to join the repeater committee. As everyone recalls, the repeater was relocated in mid-summer to the WCKK transmitting tower. At this time, our "property rental" costs went from \$60/year at Haysite, to \$150/year at WCKK. Shortly thereafter action was taken to insure the repeater could not relocate back to Haysite, where it enjoyed unparalleled success in city coverage, and new life was breathed into it in terms of usage (just check the repeater committee roster of mid-1976 before the move to WCKK versus the previous year, or years.) Another interesting observation which can and should be made is the number of users in Corry, Union City, and Wattsburg areas to show their support and appreciation for a move which could do nothing to help the metro-Erie coverage, and could only stand to benefit them, as well as other machines providing city in-depth coverage.

Think about it---what have and will the county users do to compensate the majority of WR3ACA operators, the metropolitan-area users who are paying its way? Is this another way to get the majority of supporters to meet the needs of the previous few? I will not join the RAE or repeater committee effective January 1977. Likewise, I will curtail use of WR3ACA to the absolutely essential until I see improvements in this situation.

Gentlemen, I support what I believe in. But I cannot fathom support is an organization or repeater who has money it refuses to put to use, and whose sole accomplishment through WR3ACA has been an "emergency" net which has never drilled or served in an emergency (even simulated) capacity. I will be waiting and watching.

Number 614 - October 19, 1976

IN A PUBLIC NOTICE DATED OCTOBER 18 FCC ANNOUNCED THAT BEGINNING NOVEMBER 26, 1976 AMATEURS IN THE UNITED STATES NEED NO LONGER GIVE ADVANCE WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE FCC OF PORTABLE OPERATION. IN ADDITION, EFFECTIVE THAT DATE UNITED STATES AMATEURS OPERATING THEIR STATIONS AT PORTABLE OR MOBILE LOCATIONS NEED NOT IDENTIFY AS SUCH. ALIENS OPERATING WITHIN THE U.S. UNDER RECIPROCAL PRIVILEGES ARE ALSO FREED FROM NOTIFYING THE FCC OF FORTHCOMING PORTABLE OPERATION, BUT ARE STILL BOUND BY THE IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS OF PART 97.313 OF THE FCC RULES. ALTHOUGH THE PORTABLE SIGNING REQUIREMENT WILL BE DROPPED, FCC INDICATES THAT FOR VARIOUS REASONS AN AMATEUR MAY CONTINUE TO SIGN PORTABLE.

Number 615 - October 21, 1976

IN A PUBLIC NOTICE RELEASED OCTOBER 21, FCC ANNOUNCED THAT EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 2, 1976, 1 x 2 CALL SIGNS WITH N PREFIXES WOULD BE MADE AVAILABLE TO EXTRA CLASS LICENSEES WHO QUALIFY FOR 1 x 2 CALLS. THIS ACTION, COUPLED WITH THE AVAILABILITY OF X SUFFIXES, OPENS UP 728 ADDITIONAL TWO LETTER CALL SIGNS IN EACH CALL AREA. FCC INDICATES THAT APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED NOW WILL BE HELD FOR ACTION ON NOVEMBER 2.
